To be able to take a psychiatric history in a case of alcohol use 3. To understand and evaluate for the possible comorbidities in a case of alcohol use. 4. To conduct Mental Status Examination in a case of alcohol use 5. To arrive at a provisional diagnosis of a case of alcohol use 6. To be able to understand emergency situations related to alcohol use, including delirium, agitated behaviour etc and learn to take appropriate action. 7. To understand the scope of psychological techniques, including stress management, motivational interviewing skills etc in the management of conditions related to alcohol use. 8. To understand the basics of consultation liaison psychiatry related to alcohol use. 9. To learn the skills to look for symptoms related to addiction in others and provide appropriate advice.
